First Destination Survey

Earlham Graduates - Class of 2014

This report is a coordinated effort through the Center for Integrated Learning, the Alumni and Advancement Office, and the Institutional Research Office.

These data were collected from the Earlham College graduates, Class of 2014. Senior students were surveyed a few days prior to commencement with a paper survey asking about their "first destination" after receiving their Bachelor's award. After that initial data collection, Administrative Faculty through the Center for Integrated Learning followed up with the non-respondents from the paper survey. They made telephone calls and conducted internet searches in further attempts to identify graduates' primary occupation. Finally, the Alumni and Advancement Office compiled this information and categorized these occupations into the groups you see below.
