First Destination Survey Earlham Graduates - Class of 2018

This report is a coordinated effort through the Center for Career and Community Engagement, the Alumni and Advancement Office, and the Institutional Research Office.

These data were collected from the Earlham College graduates, Class of 2018. Senior students were surveyed a few days prior to commencement. Data represents information about "first destination" after receiving a Bachelor's award. After the initial data collection in May 2018, Administrative Faculty through the Career and Community Engagement Office followed up with non-respondents. Telephone calls and internet searches were conducted in further attempts to identify graduates' primary occupation. Finally, the Alumni and Advancement Office compiled this information and categorized these occupations into the groups you see below.
