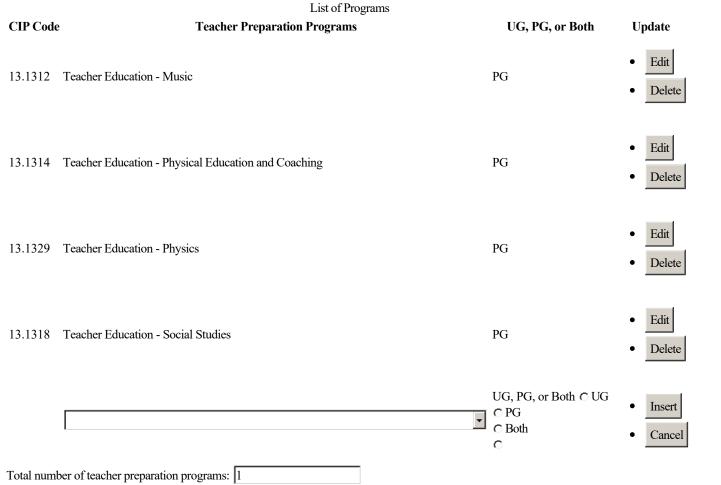

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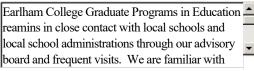

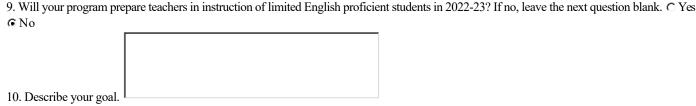

We engage students with the concept of digital literacy, which they apply in practice during the summer middle school practicum. All students learn how to use spreadsheet software and are required to compile, graph, and disaggregate data on student learning. Students are also introduced to Universal Design for Learning -- its history and current practices -- and this is assessed via an oral exam. The spring semester is concluded with an action research project based in candidates' classroom and school. This project includes research of current literature, observations of students, planned and implemented action, and compilation and presentation of data and reflections. Throughout the program, we model the use of Web 2.0 tools and require our student teachers to both use the tools to complete projects of their own and to design projects that engage their students in using those tools to interact with content. We also teach and model digital tools that give in-the-moment assessment feedback. The use of technology is assessed in multiple places, including the portfolio. Many of our students get hands-on experience in implementing online instruction for eLearning days.
