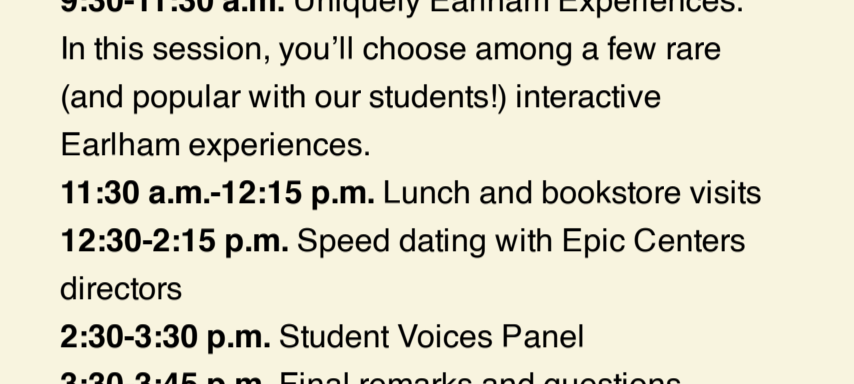

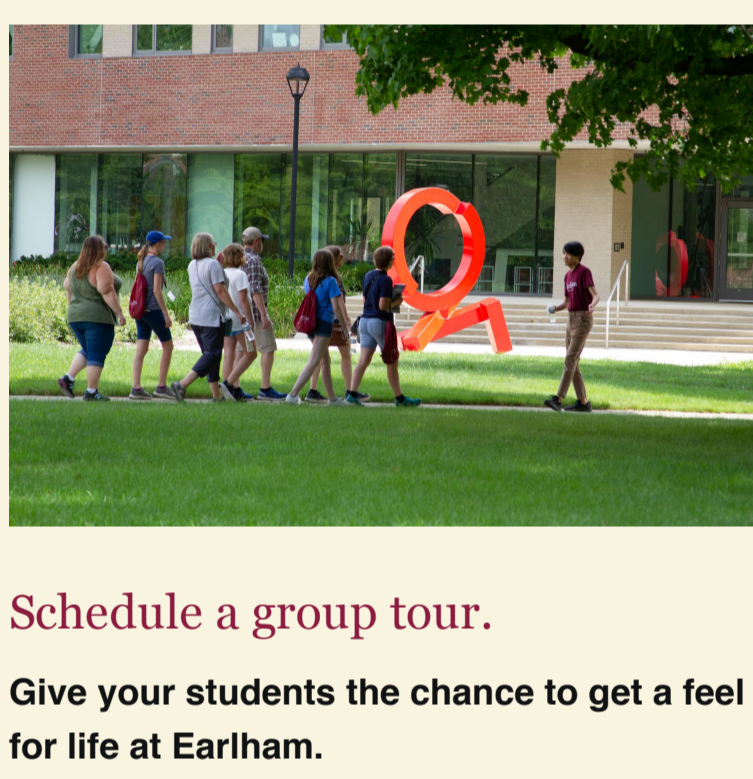
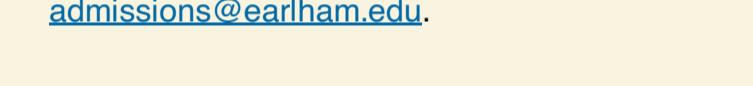

For prospective students and families:

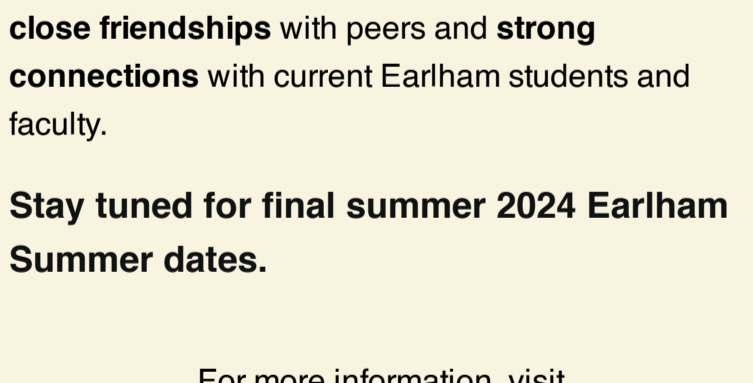
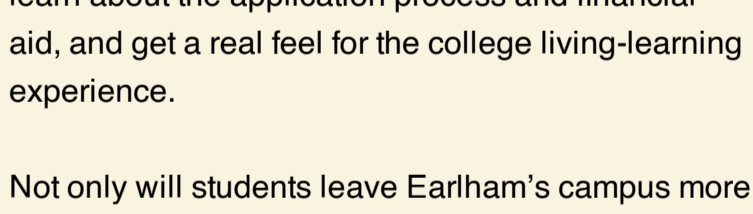

- The application process, financial aid and scholarships.

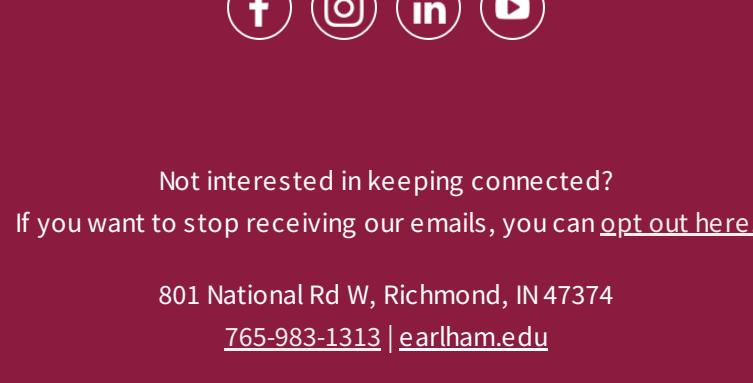
On your group visit, your students will have the option to **explore campus** on a tour, **discover more about Earlham programs** during an info session and **enjoy lunch** in the dining hall.

Earlham student spotlight

Meet Austi Jenkins '25

As part of a group of twelve students and three faculty members, **Austi Jenkins '25** recently represented Earlham at the oldest and largest celebration of arts and culture in the world—the Edinburgh Festival Fringe.

The group performed "The Further Misadventures of Martin Hathaway: Shipwrecked off Heramathea's Cove," which was written by Richmond author Kathryn Clare Glen and adapted for stage by Earlham professor Lynne Perkins Socey. Jenkins was cast in the lead role of Daisy Fitzgerald McNamara, the captain of the airship Nephthys.

Though she's traveled within the United States, this was Jenkins' first trip out of the country. A theatre arts major from Richmond, Indiana, Jenkins was excited to explore her family's Scottish roots.

Airfare and accommodations for this trip were free for students through Earlham's signature career discernment program, the [Epic Advantage](#). The program offers funding up to \$5,000 for every student to participate in an internship, research experience or other career discerning experience before graduation.

Participating in opportunities like this gives Earlham students insight into the careers they could pursue after graduation. "Before I came to Earlham, I wasn't sure if theatre was going to be a hobby or something I might consider for my career," said Jenkins. "Now I know I want to do this professionally after college."
