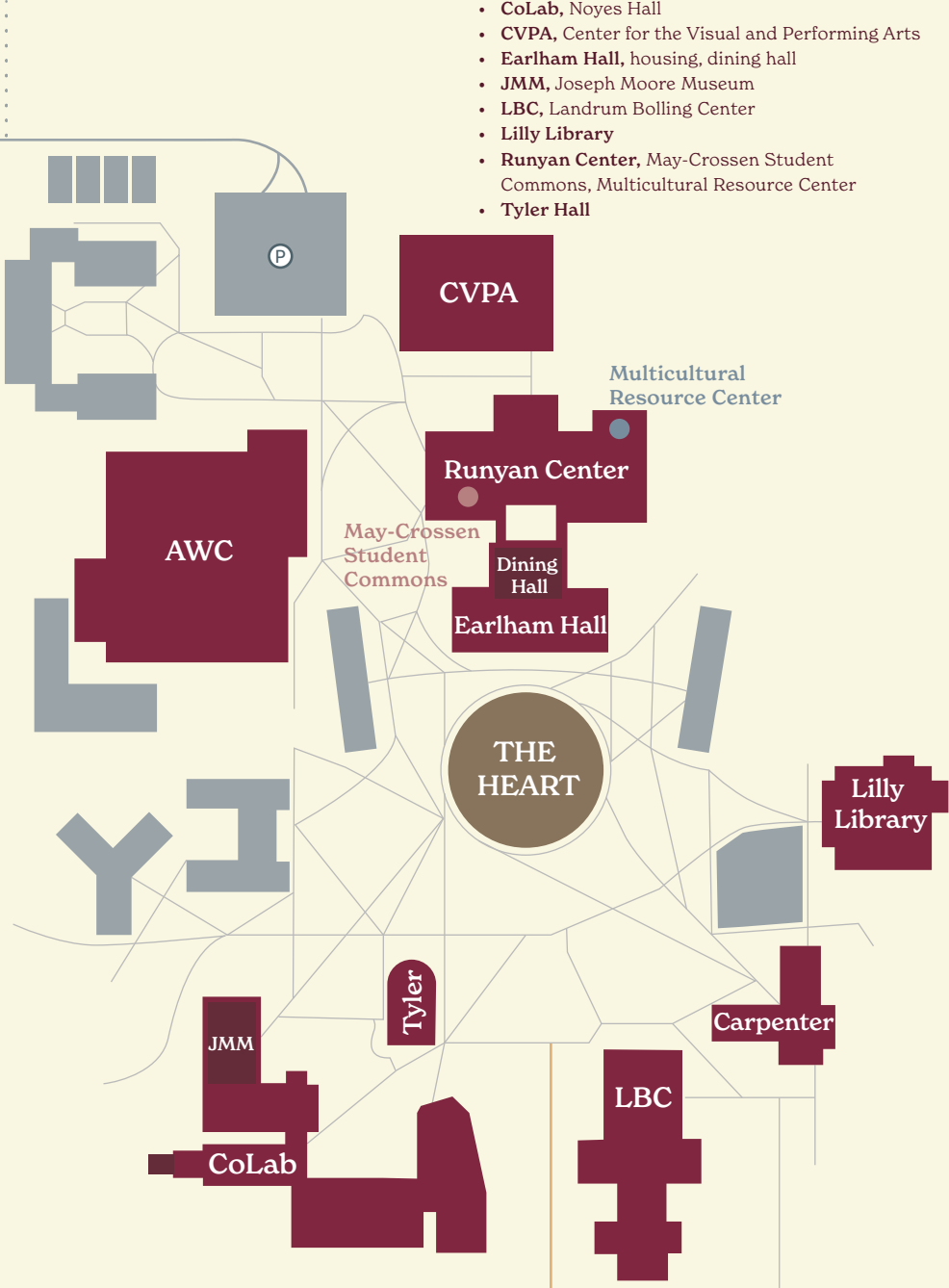

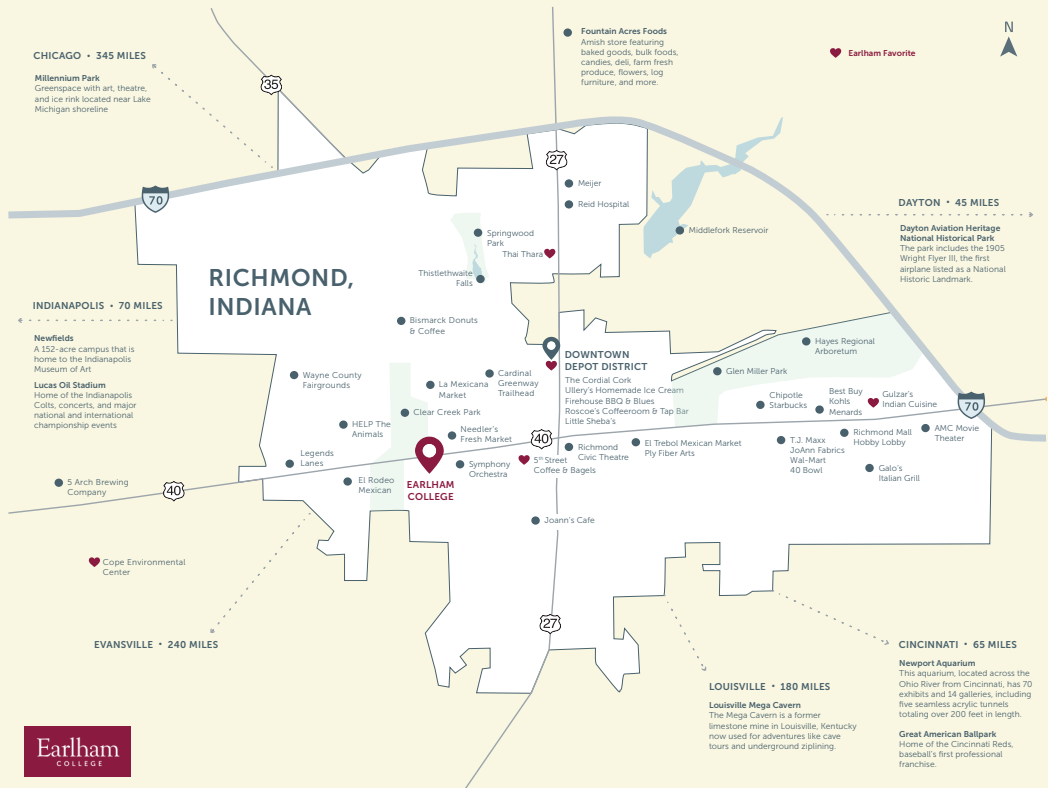

Whether you and your family are looking for something to do this weekend or you're taking notes for next year, there's plenty to do in and around Richmond.

Family fun

- Head to the Wayne County Historical Museum, a great place to soak up the rich heritage of Wayne County, Indiana.
- Take a walk on the Cardinal Greenway trail, Indiana's longest span of recreational trails.
- Roll in style at The Skate roller-skating rink.
- Score a turkey (three strikes in a row) at either Legends Lanes or Richmond 40 Bowl.
- Find the bottom of a box of popcorn while taking in a movie at AMC Classic Richmond II.
- Bird-watch at Cope Environmental Center.
- Find your superpower at Comic Relief comic bookstore.
- Turn the tables at Block Head Records Store.
- Mini road trip: Visit the Levi and Catharine Coffin house, known as the "Grand Central Station of the Underground Railroad" in Fountain City (20-minute drive north on Hwy 27). Tour the home and find out how these brave Quakers helped more than 1,000 freedom seekers.
- Try the free samples and pick up some fresh donuts at Fountain Acres, an Amish-run store in Fountain City.

Athletics
