<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Some external reports (e.g., required federal <u>IPEDS</u> reporting) require binary selections (male or female) of student head counts. If the field for self-identified gender has a value, we record Cisgender Men & Transgender Men as Men; and Cisgender Woman and Transgender Women as Women. When there is no self-identified gender or the student has selected a non-binary option, we assign the designation based on the students' legal sex when available. When this information is also unknown, we assign the designation based on the gendered nature of the name. When the name does not have clear gendered associations or those associations are unknown, categorization of the remaining unknown individuals is random.
