FTE = 10301/15 = 686.7

Credit Activity = 60 MEd credits + 15 MAT credits = 75 GPE credits FTE = 75/12 = 6.25

**ESR** 

Credit Activity = 24 credits (non-degree seeking) + 376.5 credits (degree-seeking) = 400.5 ESR credits

FTE = 400.5/12 = 33.37

In the current report, we divide by 12 for graduate students & 15 for undergraduate students, as it only covers one semester.
